AND NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Council direct Administration to create a Racism and Diversity Task Force no later than October 31, 2020 that will review our current municipal processes and activities and bring back to council concrete suggestions to address racism and discrimination in Okotoks and make recommendations to help create a safer and more inclusive community where individuals of all races, religions, gender, sexual orientation and abilities feel valued and respected.
