

MUNICIPAL GRANT PROGRAMS FOR COVID-19 BUSINESS SUPPORT

Issue

Direction regarding further development of a proposed Business Support Grants Program Policy presented at the May 4, 2020 Emergency Advisory Committee is required.

Motion Proposed by Administration

That the Municipal Grant Programs for COVID-19 Business Support report be accepted as information and that further development of a proposed Business Support Grants Program Policy is no longer necessary.

Report, Analysis and Financial Implications

<u>History</u>

On May 4, 2020 a report was presented to the Emergency Advisory Committee providing an update on the Economic Development Business Recovery Plan and recommending the adoption of a Business Support Grants Program Policy.

The June 1, 2020 COVID-19 Business Recovery Survey Report listed several needs identified by the 285 survey respondents. The top eight (8) responses are listed below. None of the responses to the survey requested municipal business support grant funding:

The temporary waiver of many planning fees as approved by Council on April 27, 2020 benefited businesses and homeowners alike. As of the date of writing this report, the de facto grant amounted to more than \$26,000 in waived development permit fees (approximately 40% or over \$10,000 non-residential) and almost \$40,000 in Certificate of Compliance fees (approximately 5% or \$2,000 non-residential).

The Town contributed further funding through the Economic Development Business Disaster Recovery budget to the newly formed Okotoks Entrepreneurial Ecosystem in the amount of \$11,256 for a mental health education initiative to support local entrepreneurs. The initiative was a collaboration of the Okotoks & District Chamber of Commerce, Community Futures Highwood, and the River District Business Association to offer eight (8) webinars, eight (8) training sessions, and eight (8) coaching sessions to assist businesses in support of company culture, psychological safety, and healthy employee experience during COVID-19.

Business Supports in other Alberta Communities

The following municipal grant programs relating to COVID-19 relief for businesses were identified in a web search. Many involve partnerships with Community Futures or local Chambers of Commerce:

Edmonton Economic Recovery Grant:

- Phase 1: Matching micro-grants for businesses adapting to COVID-19 (June -December 2020). Most micro-grants will be \$1,000;
- Phase 2: Matching grants of up to \$25,000 for longer-term diversification initiatives (Beginning January 2021).

Grande Prairie Downtown Incentives Program:

- Urban Residential Grant for downtown residential infill;
- Patio Grant 50% of patio cost, up to \$5,000;
- Demolition Grant 50% of demo cost, up to \$50,000 (relates to residential infill).

Medicine Hat Business Innovation Grant:

 Grants of \$500 to \$15,000 to encourage innovation, maintain or enhance revenue streams, adapt to workplace guidelines.

Olds Business Reopening Program:

• Up to \$500 for storefronts and up to \$100 for home businesses to adapt to workplace guidelines (PPE, distancing, etc.).

Pincher Creek Business Recovery Support Program:

- Business Support Coordination up to \$500;
- Professional Development Fund up to \$1,000.

#OpeninBeaumont Campaign:

Social Media Tools.

Bow Valley Restart Fund:

• Grants of up to \$5,000.

Canmore Business 2 Business Voucher Program:

• Up to \$2,000 to access professional services to assist in building resiliency.

Based upon the feedback from our businesses, our environmental scan of current municipal service offerings and the level of support for priorities already provided, creation of a grant program is not recommended at this point in time. The situation will be continuously monitored and updates provided to allow for quick adjustment if the circumstances warrant.
