



PROVINCIAL

- 63.2% (+6.2%) cases variants, B117 is the dominant variant known to spread easier. Growth in variant P1 casesNew COVID-19 restrictions to stop the spike
- New mandatory health restrictions will help stop the spike of COVID-19 and protect the health system.
- New restrictions on outdoor social gatherings, schools, retail, restaurants, places of worship, personal and wellness services, outdoor sports and fitness, funerals, and post-secondary institutions.
- The new restrictions come into force effective May 5, unless indicated otherwise, and will remain in place for at least three weeks.
- Apply to all communities with more than 50 cases per 100,000 people and with 30 or more active cases
- Fines will double to \$2,000 for Public Health Act violations.
- Repeat offenders will be targeted with a new enforcement protocol. The protocol is now in place and will be used to coordinate a multi-agency response to repeat offenders.
- A coalition of enforcement partners will work with each other to respond as quickly as possible with the most effective measures to gain compliance in that situation.
- Partners in the provincial group include Alberta Health Services, Occupational Health and Safety, Alberta Prosecution
 Service and local police services. Alberta Gaming Liquor and Cannabis will also participate when cases involve licensees or activities under its jurisdiction.


