12. COUNCILLOR INQUIRIES AND SUGGESTIONS

Councillor Swendseid inquired if Wednesday's free public skating on the full ice surface at the Okotoks Recreation Centre will return.

Councillor Swendseid inquired what the maintenance schedule is for cracked pedestrian sidewalks.

Mayor Thorn received feedback regarding the length of the fireworks display on New Year's Eve and inquired what the service level is for these celebrations. Chief Administrative Officer Elaine Vincent provided a response that Administration recently reviewed this issue and determined the level of service going forward would be two tiered: Canada Day and New Year's Eve fireworks will be 7.5 minutes long; and Light Up fireworks will be 15 minutes long. Fireworks at the Light Up 2022 event were oversubscribed (longer than 15 minutes), making the New Year's display seem quite short in comparison.

Councillor Heemeryck requested a breakdown of the "Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program" grant and when the Town last applied for it. Chief Administrative Officer Elaine Vincent provided a response that the federal government recently announced successful grant applications and the Town of Okotoks was not included. However, Administration is hopeful in successfully receiving funding for swimming pool adjustments through a different grant.

Councillor Actemichuk inquired regarding the cost of the firework displays. Chief Administrative Officer Elaine Vincent provided a response that it is difficult to give a monetary value and is why the Town has chosen to express the fireworks as a service level versus a cost. A pyrotechnician resident volunteer's their time to conduct the displays and costs are shared with the Okotoks Dawgs for the Canada Day fireworks.

Planner Lauren Gagatek reviewed the report containing the issue that the purpose of Bylaw 19-22 is to amend Bylaw 02-21 - Municipal Development Plan in order to revise the maps relating to the future development of the lands legally described as NW 16-20-29-W4 and a portion of the NE 16-20-29-W4, and to correct an error related to the future land use mapping in the downtown.

Mayor Thorn called for presentations in favour of the proposed bylaw and there were none.

Mayor Thorn called for presentations in objection to the proposed bylaw.

Bruce Meyer came forward to express objection to the proposed bylaw and further stated that he previously submitted a letter that will be read into the record.

Council asked questions of Administration and the questions were answered.

Mayor Thorn called for Administration to provide a summary of submissions in favour and in opposition to Bylaw 19-22 received after 12:00 noon on January 4, 2023 to 7:00 p.m. on January 9, 2023.

Administration reported that three (3) submissions were received in opposition of the proposed bylaw from The Estate of Edna E. Meyer and Bruce Meyer, The Estate of Edna E. Meyer and Don Meyer, and FTI Consulting and the submissions were read into the record.

Mayor Thorn called for a 15-minute break to provide an opportunity for members of the public to submit responses to new information that may have arisen from Administration's report.
