




The bike valet was well received by the community and is expected to grow in popularity for future events!

An average of 40 bikes were placed in the valet per event!







Canning!




New Resident Visits

This summer, there were 820 New Homeowner Visits!

We directly connected with 320 Residents and left bags at 500 homes!

At the door, we discuss the watering schedule, the water rebate program, the water meter portal, the Okotoks waste app, and answer their questions!



High Water Users

Concerning Water Usage:

Anyone who consumed more than double the average amount for a billing period, averaged throughout the entire year

Approximately 49 homes watering off schedule without a water permit

This was a 67% DECREASE since last year!

Visits included educating residents about the Town's water resources and available tools to provide water wise choices



2023 Summer Program Impacts

Okotoks Waste App

There were 141 downloads *Up 23% since last year!*



Water Rebate Program

294 applicants on 458 items This years program **SOLD OUT** in mid-July!



345 households signed up since August 2022



Community Education



Irrigation Assessments

26 free irrigation assessments completed *Up* 31% since last year!

Interacted with 2116 residents at Town Events!



Total Interactions

Directly spoke to over 4000 Okotokians!





Conclusions
