12. COUNCILLOR INQUIRIES AND SUGGESTIONS

Councillor Swendseid provided an inquiry on behalf of the Foothills Regional Services Commission regarding the final destination of the solar panels from the Drake Landing Solar Community once decommissioning of the project occurs. Chief Administrative Officer Elaine Vincent provided a response that the decommissioning plan for the Drake Landing Solar Community is not approved and the final destination of the solar panels will be made public once approval is given.

Councillor Swendseid provided an inquiry regarding the absence of the Drought Monitoring Monthly Statistics report in recent Council agenda packages. Operations & Utilities Director Jeremy Huet provided a response that the next report will be provided in the May 27, 2024 Council agenda and will be included in the second Council agenda package of each month going forward. Director Huet added that the April report was not included in the Council package, but it is available on the on the Town's website.

Councillor Lang provided an inquiry regarding the possibility of using a more effective and permanent method of marking crosswalks annually.

Chief Administrative Officer Elaine Vincent provided a response that Alberta weather conditions make it challenging for manufacturers of the paint to develop a product that will have more durability, adding that occasionally the Town helps manufacturers test new products.

Operations & Utilities Director Jeremy Huet supplemented the response by adding that on arterial roadways the Town sometimes uses a thermoplastic inlay that is more durable than paint, but still has mixed results. The thermoplastic is a more expensive product and costs more to install when compared to annual repainting.

Councillor Lang provided an inquiry regarding the timeline for pothole repairs and crack sealing.

Operations & Utilities Director Jeremy Huet provided a response that crews are in the process of switching their focus from street sweeping to pothole repairs and crack sealing with work underway throughout the community.

Development Planner Colton Nickel reviewed the report containing the issue that the purpose of Bylaw 14-24 is to adopt the North Okotoks Area Structure Plan which provides a framework for future urban development of approximately +/- 129.4 hectares (+/- 320.0 acres), encompassing the two quarter-sections of NW-33-20-29-W4M and NE-33-20-29-W4M.
