It supported diverse events that fostered community connections, provided platforms for artists, and brought vibrancy to the local arts scene. <u>Acoustic Summer Nights & Arts Market Final Report Summary – Okotoks Arts</u> Council

Summary: The inaugural Acoustic Summer Nights & Arts Market, a series of live acoustic music performances and an art market, hosted by the Okotoks Arts Council (OAC), built on the momentum of seasonal Acoustic Nights at the Old Church Theatre. To accomplish this event the OAC hired a local contractor to produce and host the events that created a welcoming, positive atmosphere downtown. Despite weather-related date changes, the events were successfully rescheduled with the Town's support. However, the art market component's effectiveness waned, prompting a review of how to better integrate visual arts in future series.

Build flexibility into planning to accommodate Alberta's rapidly changing weather. Overall, the event was a success, strengthening community connections and providing a platform for musicians and visual artists.
