




# Canada now has more seniors than kids under 15

# What does this mean for Older Adults in the Foothills

 With an incident rate of 8% and 70,000 in the Foothills Region.....

An estimated 5,600 people aged 65+ are experiencing some form of elder abuse in the Foothills Region.

#### Family Violence in Canada: 2015 Statistical Profile

Of the 10 Canadian provinces, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta had the highest number of senior victims of police reported family violence.

The rate of family violence against seniors living in urban area was lower than for those living in rural communities.

# Elder Abuse: Under the Radar

For every one case of elder abuse that comes to the attention of a responsible entity...

Up to 8% of the population of older adults in any community are experiencing some form of elder abuse. (St. Aidan's, 2016)

another twenty three cases never come to light.





- Ability to leverage current knowledge, services and expertise of multiple service organizations and individuals.
- More effective and efficient approaches to addressing elder abuse.

## Vision

Older adults in Okotoks, High River, Turner Valley, Black Diamond and the M.D. Foothills No. 31 live in a safe, caring and responsive community where their rights, dignity and well-being is valued and they are free from abuse and neglect.

#### **Elder Abuse**

A single or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an **expectation of trust**, which causes harm or distress to an older person.

Elder can take several forms including: Physical, sexual, psychological, emotional, spiritual, financial and material abuse, abandonment, neglect and serious loss of dignity

(World Health Organization definition adapted to include spiritual abuse)

#### Who Are We Talking About?

- A person 65+ years of age,
- Any age exceptions are determined on a case-by-case basis.
